About Immunotherapy

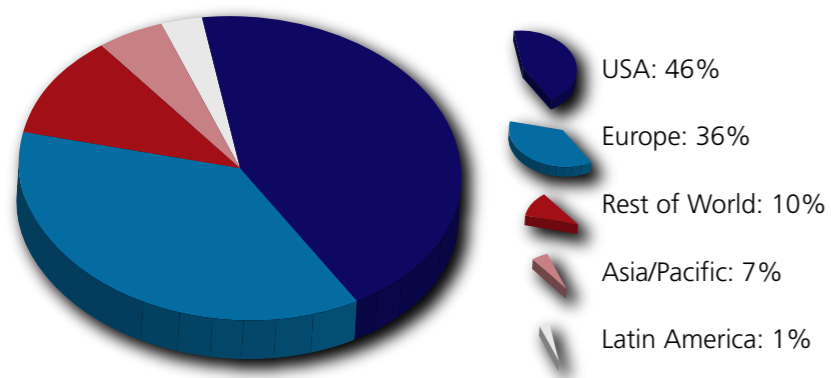
